TRAVEL & DIABETES

- Carry diabetes ID such as medic alert jewelry and a letter from your physician or diabetes care team stating that you have diabetes and the medication that you need to treat it if you are carrying insulin. Alternatively, ask your pharmacy for a copy of your prescription.
- Take twice the quantity of medical supplies you would normally use for your diabetes.
- It is advisable to buy travel insurance, as not all countries give the level of cover of your provincial health care plan and there will be costs involved with any treatment required abroad.'.
- Split your diabetes supplies into separate bags.
- Find out where you can get supplies of insulin at your destination, in case of emergency.
- Flights often cross time zones. If you treat your diabetes with medication or insulin, it's important you check with your diabetes care team. If you need to make any changes to your regime be mindful that a hot or cold climate may affect how your insulin and blood glucose monitor work.



STORING INSULIN SAFELY

- The insulin that you are currently using can be kept at room temperature (under 25°C), which makes it more comfortable to inject.
- The best place to store most types of insulin that you are not currently using is in the fridge.
 Don't put it in – or too close to – the freezer compartment.
- Some insulins have slightly different storage needs, so always read the patient information leaflet that comes with yours.
- Keep spare vials or cartridges of insulin in their boxes in the fridge.
- Check the pack for the expiry date and don't use it if it has expired.
- Don't expose insulin to sunlight or high temperatures.
